## **PROGRAM**

Dr. Asa Morton provided the program, which provided highlights from the humanitarian trip he and a team of doctors and volunteers made to Tejutla, Guatemala recently. The team, which performed 210 operations and cared for 2,300 patients, is sponsored in part by the Rotary Club of Coronado and the Rotary Club of Mission Valley.

The concept of the trip is to provide First World surgery in a Third World setting.

Several team members gave their impressions of the trip and Morton provided a DVD that showed some of the families positively impacted by the trip. There was also a display of some of the surgical equipment that was purchased with funds provided by the Rotary Clubs.

Dr. Morton, who spent 24 years in the Navy, noted the fact that several team members were active duty Navy personnel. Also, the Navy provided a warehouse at the Navy Medical Facility for the equipment and supplies used on the trip.

At the conclusion of the presentation, Terry Caster, a member of the Rotary Club of Mission Valley, agreed to provide a matching grant from the Caster Family Foundation of \$25,000 per year for the next 10 years for Dr. Morton's humanitarian efforts. The Caster family members among them have 55 Paul Harris fellowships. This is another excellent example of Rotary making a difference in the world.
