PROGRAM

After a Syvernesque introduction by **Dave Knop**, Walter Green was finally allowed to the podium to talk to us about his volunteer passion at the Elementary Institute of Science (EIS). EIS was founded in 1964 by a teacher who thought that there was a whole population of students being underserved in science instruction. Somehow he acquired a 2400 square foot house at 51 st & Euclid and began a school program that has captured the imagination of 7-13-year olds in that less-than-wonderful neighborhood. Four years ago they moved from their little white house to a state-of-the-art 15,000 square foot facility right smack on the same corner. So far, they have over 5,000 "graduates" from
