## FINES & RECOGNITIONS

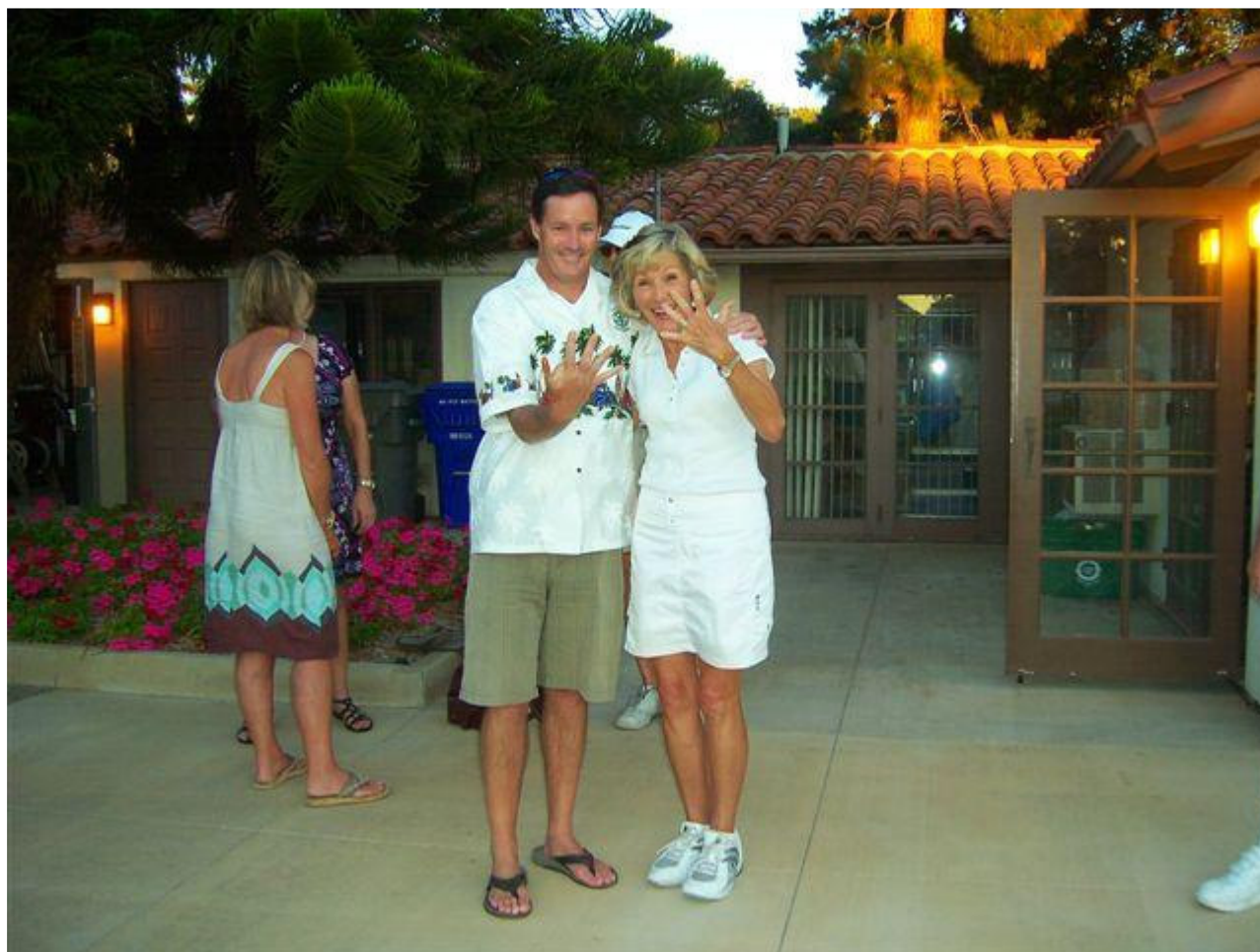

## PROGRAM

**Suzanne Manuel** introduced fellow Rotarian (Club 33) Chris Sichel of the Make-a-Wish Foundation. MAW was started in Phoenix in 1980 and has grown to 64 chapters and over 100 offices. They grant wishes to children with life-threatening conditions, not necessarily terminal. They are a well run foundation with over 80% of their funds going to programs. Locally, twelve professionals work with over 200 volunteers. About 300 children in San Diego are considered candidates in each year and 180 wishes are granted. The average cash cost of granting a wish is approximately \$7000. The Hotel Del is a huge supporter of Make-a-Wish and does a lot of quiet things to help.
