Bob Kipperman was fined \$100 for winning the Western Industry Award for excessive rhinestones on belts.

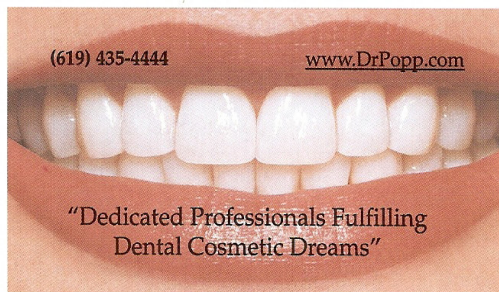
Marie Highsmith has the dubious distinction of being the current longest standing Red Badge member. \$75 please.
