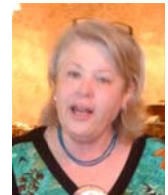

\$200 ... I mean \$322.58, which really is only \$200 ... (See explanation below) **RUDY VAN HUNNICK** he was happy to announce he just turned 80 years old (It is hard to believe that RUDY IS 80!). Assistant to the Governor **SCOTT CADWALLADER** introduced our District Governor **DAVID BREEDING** and gave a brief biography.



DISTRICT GOVERNOR DAVID BREEDING began by stating that this club is, "The greatest show in town". He was sorry to have missed the program two weeks previously with the Barbershop Quartet. He also acknowledged **RANDY MITCHELL** for celebrating his 90th Birthday and **RUDY'S 80TH**.

He very much likes the "branding" of the Oceanside Rotary Shirts that the club now has to wear here at the meetings and out in the community.

He proceeded to tell us the story of crossing a Bridge of Learning about Rotary. Why he likes being a Rotarian. It all began in 1998 in India while on a 6 month Cruise of Education with Students on the high seas and while in India at a railroad station. Early in the morning they came across a group of beggars with twisted bodies - all Polio Victims. Many were crawlers, some brought stretchers with the victims on them. The

10 students took the lunch boxes that had been prepared for them for the day's activities and gave to the Polio Victims... the beggars. Yours truly, this week's Shorelines Editor has also seen this very same scene all over India on a recent trip several years ago. It is permanently imbedded in your mind when you see this. How lucky we all are to have our facilities and all our limbs working as they are expected to. This scene haunted DAVID also for many years to come.

In January 1999 he saw a Bumper Sticker that read GOOD – BYE POLIO THANKS ROTARY with the Rotary Logo on the sticker. Prior to this he knew nothing of Rotary working to eradicate Polio worldwide. DAVID'S mother was also a Polio victim many years previously.

He joined Rotary in Fallbrook and soon found himself on a journey with a group of other ROTARIANS on a NID (National Immunization Day) trip in India for several weeks. It was an incredible life changing trip to help young children to receive the inoculation drops to fight against Polio.

WE are part of something big... 33,000 strong communities of Rotarians helping to be involved in Community Building. OCEANSIDE CRAB FEST is just this sort of Community involvement. The club is working hard to raise money for the Veteran's Kitchen, a great project for this club.

He is very proud of what ROTARY does in Fallbrook. There are 3 clubs there, and ROTARY teams work together to help the community. Service clubs and volunteers are the GLUE that brings communities together.

This year is the first time to combine 3 events into one DISTRICT CONFERENCE in Fallbrook this October. It is also the opportunity to stay with ROTARIANS in their homes in Fallbrook at no cost to the members visiting.

He then showed a video of what the conference will entail. SERIOUS ROTARY BUSINESS and lots of "getting to know each other" time, too. Sign ups are now ongoing and these home stays will fill fast. Get online to get the information to register.

International President RAY KLINGINSMITH has a long tradition of "Building Communities and Bridging Continents." The OCEANSIDE ROTARY CLUB has also found ways to do good things around the globe with their international projects.

Each Rotarian gives to Annual Programs Funds a general pool of all humanitarian funds. Every dollar is used according to the donor's intent. Humanitarian Projects are a great part of all 1.2 million Rotarians working to make the world better.

District Governor DAVID BREEDING hopes that your journey with ROTARY brings to know and appreciate ROTARY more and more each week, each month, each year.

President VERNON thanked our visiting Governor and invited he and his wife MARY LEE to the podium to present them with a basket of wine and flowers.
