Alyssa, an exemplary student, plans to graduate in a month, then go to Grossmont college and then to a cosmetology school. Her goal is to own her own salon.

Our speakers were from the Ramona High School Interact Club, which Rotary supports. We met Jolie, the new advisor for the group, as well as some of the members. Interact, like Rotary, is service-oriented. While small in numbers (like Ramona Rotary), the RHS Interact Club has been especially active this year.

The club sponsored a Kiss-the-Goat fundraiser for Heifer International, a group that helps provide food to small third-world villages. Bottles were set out for each participant, and the one whose bottle collected the most money was designated the goat kisse.

Interact members conducted a Teens for Jeans campaign to help homeless teens. This campaign expanded beyond Ramona High, to all schools in the district as well as to some churches—and almost 700 pairs of jeans were collected!

In addition, the members collected toiletries for tsunami relief and participated in a toy drive for the Ramona Food & Clothes Closet during the holidays.

These young people definitely should be an inspiration to us!
