In our district, Louise has served as a Foundation Mentor, District Incoming Scholar Chair, District Conference Chair, District Strategic Planning leader, Strategic Visioning Chair, District Services Committee Chair, Host Counselor for a Rotary Scholar, Assistant Governor, and Governor's Chief of Staff. She was honored as District Rotarian of the Year for 2009. She is a graduate of the District Leadership Development Academy and the District Masters Level Leadership Academy.

Outside our district, she has been a Paul Harris Society member for eight years and currently a Major Donor, led Strategic Planning sessions for two other districts as well as PETS committees, served as moderator for a session on Rotary Friendship Exchange at the Rotary International Convention in New Orleans, visited clubs across the US and around the world, including the District 9270's District Conference in Durban, South Africa, authoring and completed a matching grant for South Africa, been very active in the Rotary International Travel and Hosting Fellowship for the past 6 years, and has been very active in numerous local community service activities.

In addition, the Membership Committee developed the following action plan which will be further explored at its next Membership Committee meeting, tentatively set for November 15.

1. Reschedule Fireside Chat;
2. Develop a list of 18 prospective members and organizations to solicit members from;
3. Developed a preliminary list of 10 community organizations to invite to a fundraising scoping meeting;
4. Identify our first "Bring a Guest" day for sometime in November/December (date TBD) – want a dazzling program for this specific day. Make this a quarterly activity.
5. Add club meeting agenda item: "Member Bios" beginning November 3 with Jim Peasley (5-10 minutes). We will do one per month at the first meeting of each month;
6. Formed Club's first Outreach team to meet with prospective members (Sandy Pugliese and Augie Caires); more to be identified; and
7. Further discussion on how to engage every club member in promoting membership and the identification of potential members from their sphere of influence base.

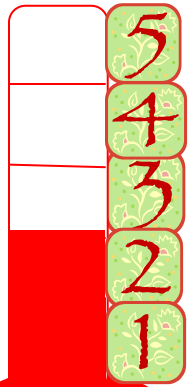

6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community.
7. Honor the trust that Rotary and fellow Rotarians provide and not do anything that will bring disfavor or reflect adversely on Rotary or fellow Rotarians.
8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

President's Message



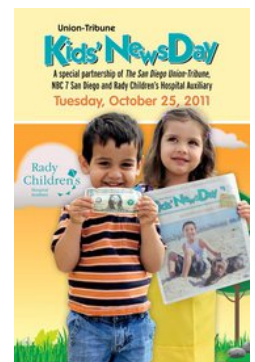
