

**Jeffry Cadorette, PDG** retired from healthcare in 1999 after a 25-year career as a physical therapist. He had been President and CEO of Physical Therapy Associates of Delaware County in Pennsylvania until merging his practice with Riddle Memorial Hospital to form the Riddle Rehabilitation Institute and Riddle Sports Medicine. He now serves as Vice President of Administration and Development at Media Real Estate Company where he is active in all phases of commercial real estate sales and leasing, tenant representation and new project development in addition to overseeing company strategic planning, office administration and lease negotiations.

He received a bachelor's Degree in Science and a Master's Degree in Education from Springfield College and a post graduate degree in physical therapy from the University of Pennsylvania.

He is the past Chairman of the Board of the Rocky Run YMCA and served on the board for the 14 years. In 2001 Rocky Run opened a new 40,000 square foot facility. He was Honorary Chair of the Building for the Future Phase II Capital Campaign which resulted in a 22,000 SF expansion of the Y. He is a past Board member of the YMCA of Philadelphia & Vicinity and past Chair of their Branch Operations Committee.

He was a six year member of the Board of Trustees of Springfield College and has been named Volunteer of the Year twice by both the College and the Rocky Run Y. He is the past Vice President and one of the co-founders of Healthy Communities Initiative, an organization that links together non-profits, churches, synagogues, the local hospital and the local school district to work on providing a healthier environment for our youth to develop in. He is President of the Board of Trustees of Tyler Arboretum, a 650 acre parcel of nationally acclaimed plant and tree collections just outside of Philadelphia.

A Rotarian with the Rotary Club of Media, PA since 1977, Jeff served as Governor of District 7450 in 1998-1999. He has four times been District Trainer and continues to serve on the District Training Team. He is a member of the 7450 District Rotary Foundation Committee and currently serves as Alumni sub-committee Chair. He is a member of the Zones 31-32 Rotary Foundation Training Team. In 2003 he was appointed by RI President Jonathan Majiyagbe of Nigeria to a two-year term as Strategic Advisor to the Annual Programs Fund of the Rotary Foundation of Rotary International. In 2005 he accepted an appointment as the Zone 32 Rotary Foundation Alumni Coordinator (RFAC), a position he continues to serve in. In 2007 he was appointed Assistant General Coordinator of RFAC's worldwide. On July 1, 2009 he will assume the role of General Coordinator and has accepted a position on the Rotary Foundation Alumni Advisory Committee in Evanston.

He was a Campaign Associate for the Mid-Atlantic region in the Polio Eradication Private Sector Initiative, a joint effort of The Rotary Foundation and the United Nations Foundation to raise the final dollars necessary for eradication of polio from the planet. The Mid-Atlantic Team raised over \$2 million, more than any other team in the world.

He was a delegate to the Rotary International 2004 and 2007 Council on Legislation in Chicago.

He has represented the President of Rotary International at District Conferences in Connecticut, Arizona, Kansas, Pennsylvania and Florida.

Jeff has been the keynote and motivational speaker at numerous district conferences and Rotary Foundation dinners, workshops and seminars across the country. He has also been the keynote speaker at the New York Multi-district PETS in Syracuse, the New England Multi-district PETS in New Hampshire, the Mid-Atlantic Multi-district PETS, the Arizona Multi-district PETS in Phoenix and the Heartlands Multi-district PETS in Kansas.

Over the past 15 years Jeff has helped dozens of charities raise over \$2 million dollars by donating his time as an amateur auctioneer for their fund raising events. He donates his fee to charity.

Jeff has traveled to South America as part of a Matching Grant project to set up a Village Bank in Lima Peru. This was a joint project between the Media Club and El Rimac Club in Lima. The bank provides loans to impoverished women that allow them to set up small businesses and become self-sufficient. It operates on the proven principles of micro-credit. In the fall of 1999 he spent 8 days in Madagascar participating in a polio immunization campaign which was the culmination of The Philadelphia Challenge which he initiated during his year as Governor in cooperation with the Rotary Club of Philadelphia. He accompanied a team of 27 who made the trip from District 7450. The Philadelphia Challenge raised record dollars for The Rotary Foundation and allowed District 7450 to lead Zones 31 & 32 in every category of giving to The Rotary Foundation in 1998-1999. In December of 2003 he traveled to Russia on behalf of the YMCA to assist in fund development initiatives. He is a Rotary Foundation Benefactor, a Rotary Foundation Major Donor, a Charter Member of the District 7450 Paul Harris Society and a multiple Guy Gundaker Fellow of the District 7450 Gundaker Foundation.
